

AWARDING OF PRIZES

All exhibits will be judged on their merits and prizes are awarded at the Judge's discretion.

Disputes: Must be lodged in writing, with a non-refundable fee of \$10, and submitted to the Administration Officer by 5.00pm on Monday 13 October 2025, later disputes cannot be considered.

General Exhibit Prize Money: All prize money, except ring events, will be paid from the Treasurer's Office on Show Day from 3.00pm—5.00pm. Please bring your "Entrant's Entry Summary Sheet" for identification purposes.

Cash prizes valued at \$25 or more will be presented with the trophies at 4.00pm in front of the Youth Hall.

Any money not collected at these times will be forfeited to the Society's funds.

General Exhibit Trophy Presentations: All specials awards and trophies will be presented in front of the Youth Hall at 4.00pm.

Please be in attendance, or arrange for the collection of your award or trophy, the Society cannot be responsible for items not collected on the day.

President's Trophy: The President's Trophy will be awarded to the exhibitor gaining the most points in the Sheep, Wool, Cattle and Agriculture sections. To be eligible, exhibitors must gain points in more than one section.







3 eggs

1 cup brown sugar

155g (5oz) butter

1 1/4 cups SR flour

1 cup plain flour

1 tsp. mixed spice 1/4 tsp. bicarb soda

440gm can of pineapple pieces (sweetened) not crushed

Method

- 1. Place the mixed fruit, sugar, butter and pineapple pieces (inc. Juice) into saucepan and simmer for 5 minutes.
- 2. Allow to cool, then beat the eggs slightly and stir into the fruit mixture.
- 3. Sift together the flours, mixed spice and soda and fold into the mixture.
- 4. Place mixture in a round cake tin (18–20cm diam) which has been lined with two thicknesses of grease proof paper.
- 5. Bake in a moderate oven for 1 1/2 to 2 hours.
- 6. Cover when cooked and leave to cool in a tin until completely cold.

"When the Schedule Coordinator reminded me that I needed to provide a favourite cake recipe, I was a little stumped as I'm not much of a baker! She kindly suggested her lovely Pear Upside Down Cake, but since I'm not a fan of pears, I kept thinking.... and remembered the Pineapple Upside Down Cake I made back in high school. I dug out my 1981 Bretton Woods Cook Book and discovered it was actually listed as a Pineapple Upside Down Pudding – so not quite right for this purpose. So, I picked another cake from the book that wasn't already covered by a different Schedule class."

Ingredients

200g SR Flour 100g Margarine

100g Sugar

1/4 tsp Salt

75g Desiccated Coconut

1 Egg

1 tbsp Milk

Method

- 1. Prepare 20cm cake tin by lining with greaseproof paper, greasing and flouring.
- 2. Put oven on to 180c, 350f, Gas No 4.
- 3. Sieve flour and salt, add sugar.
- 4. Add margarine and rub into flour using fingertips aerating at the same time.
- 5. Stop when the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs, add coconut and mix.
- 6. Make a well in centre of mixture and pour in beaten egg and milk.
- 7. Mix with fork, or round bladed knife, until dry ingredients are mixed in.
- 8. Mixture should be fairly stiff, and fall from the spoon when shaken hard.
- 9. Place in prepared tin and bake in oven for 1 hour, until well risen and brown.
- 10. Reduce oven temperature to 150c, 300f, Gas No 2.
- 11. Test cake with skewer and turn onto cooling rack when cooked.



Encouragement Classes are a great starting point for riders and horses who are still finding their stride, while Open Classes offer a chance for more experienced combinations to shine.


